TRANSLATING

You can establish a translation career by working for an organisation such as the UN and European Commission; however, many translators are self-employed and work on a freelance basis or with translation agencies.

A degree is essential for staff translator posts in European Union institutions, as is a thorough knowledge of at least two official European Union languages in addition to the native language: www.europa.eu/index_en.htm
